## Post Covid-19, People Mobility and Migrant Workers

## Abstract

COVID-19 situation in Thailand has affected migrant workers in various sectors, as well as Thai workers. However, the impacts to migrant workers are more complex, since they are tied with other conditions which have made migrants in Thailand more vulnerable, such as migration status, working and employment conditions, living conditions, lack of rights accessibility, language barrier, etc. Furthermore, in order to response to the situation, the government has approved the Cabinet Resolution on administration of migrant workers in COVID-19 situation in August 4th, allowing migrant workers from Myanmar, Laos, and Cambodia, to change their employers.

The study on "Administration of Migrant Workers after COVID-19: New Conditions to Change Employers" aims to explore the impacts of COVID-19 on migrant workers in Thailand, as well as the probability to set new conditions which migrant workers can change their employers due to COVID-19 pandemic, and to develop recommendations for administration of migrant workers in Thailand.
